**Famine Appeal 2015:
 Alleviating Human Suffering**

The Catholic Diocese of Nakuru (CDN), Kenya, was established in 1968. Presently, the diocese is involved in pastoral care and promoting human development activities to a Catholic population of approximately 250,000 in two counties, Nakuru and Baringo. The region covered by the diocese has approximately 1.3M inhabitants.

Drought is not new to Kenya. In the Northern enclaves of Baringo and East Pokot, drought is again ravaging thousands and dangerously leaving many more to be dependent on food aid. There are reports of human and livestock deaths, acute food shortage and increased migration by pastoralist communities due to depletion of pasture and water for livestock; this situation has already sparked off conflict over struggle for dwindling pasture and water resources with host communities. As a result, school drop-outs have increased significantly with kids abandoning learning to become migrant herders. In our parishes, for instance, priests and nuns serve hundreds of families with the much needed food, water, and medical supplies.

To supplement these efforts, we ask that you join us to pray and ease the burden for the people impacted by malnutrition and starvation.

Here is our plan:

1. Provide targeted supplementary feeding to 5,000 school-going children.
2. Provide access to safe water for an estimated 50,000 individuals in pastoral and marginal agricultural areas affected by drought.
3. Promote hygiene and sanitation for an estimated 50,000 individuals in pastoral and marginal agricultural areas affected by drought.

Marriage: To schedule a wedding, engaged couples must meet with their Pastor at least 8 months before their proposed wedding date. Preparation for the sacrament includes attending a diocesan program such as Engaged Encounter or Pre Cana, and completing the FOCUS Inventory. All couples of child-bearing age also need to take a full Natural Family Planning course. Pre-registration for each of these programs is mandatory for all marriages within the Diocese of St Augustine.

Baptism: Preparation must be made in advance and Baptismal Class for the parents is required. For the next Baptismal preparation class for parents wishing to have their children baptized, please contact the Parish Office.

All Sponsors: Sponsors for all Sacraments must be active Catholics. Anyone asking to receive a document from the parish to be a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation in another parish must be an active Catholic at OLGC. This implies regular Mass attendance and participation in the support of the community.

Stewardship Reflection:

May 31, 2015 – The Most Holy Trinity

Dt 4: 32-34, 39-40; Ps 33: 4-6, 9, 18-20, 22; Rom 8: 14-17; Mt 28: 16-20

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. The Holy Trinity is one of the most fundamental mysteries of our faith. We profess our belief in the Holy Trinity as part of the Nicene Creed, our Profession of Faith, which we join together to say at Mass (The Apostles' Creed, another form, may be used at Masses where children are in the majority). The word "creed" is drawn from the Latin word *credo*, which means, "I believe."



According to some traditions the Apostles composed the Apostles' Creed on Pentecost Sunday, which we celebrated one week ago. It is a natural progression for us to celebrate this Feast at this time, just after Pentecost and the end of our Easter season. As indicated we consider the Holy Trinity as a Mystery of our faith. A Mystery in this regard means that this is something that goes beyond our ability to genuinely understand it completely.

That and other mysteries of the faith are sometimes a challenge for us as Catholics. If we do not understand nor fully grasp something, we may have a tendency to doubt, to have reservations. One of the joys of stewardship is trusting completely in God, of accepting the fact that we may never have all the answers. Needing all the answers is a human failing. As professed Catholics we need to accept, and we need to follow and commit to the Lord's call to discipleship.

THE TRINITY IS LOVE

Theologians throughout the Christian centuries have spilled much ink (and, on occasion, some blood) in describing and defining the mystery of the Holy Trinity. One of the earliest, most poetic, and beautiful descriptions comes from St. Augustine in *De Trinitas*, wherein he describes the Trinity as One (the Father) who loves, One (the Son) who is loved, and One (the Spirit) who is love. And these three Ones are also one Three.

It might be wisest for us to leave the technical wrangling to the academic theologians, and focus on the fact that the three Persons of the Trinity are indeed persons; they are best known and understood in their love for each other and for us. We are made in the image of those loving persons, and our best relationships are lived out in the context of love. Truly loving relationships are inexhaustible mysteries to be lived in joy. If this is true of our human relationships, how much more so is it true of our relationship with the Trinity. And how much more does it call upon us to be joyful, loving witnesses of the holy mystery of the One-in-Three. This is the mystery to which we were called when we were chosen to be God's own, baptized with water in the name of the Holy Trinity.
