OLGC NEWS

Dear Parishioners,

Currently underway is a small task-force that is taking a careful look at our land and building development needs. Included in this group are not only parishioners with significant building experience, but also professional site engineers and architects. This is a complicated process for a number of significant reasons.

DEMOGRAPHIC TRENDS:

Trends are changing in the U.S. regarding religious believers.

For instance, varying age-groups have very different areas of consideration that they will support. As among the top three in importance? When it comes to places of worship, among those groups called "Seniors" and "Baby-Boomers" a significant number support building places of worship as a value. However, even here it is under 50% – 48% for Seniors and 42% for "Boomers".

Of the next two groups, Millennials and Generation X, places of worship are not even listed as among their top three concerns. Rather, Millennials are focused on health, social service and children (highest priority at 39%). Generation X tends to be focused on animal welfare, health and children/youth development.

A parish plans for the long-term. Since parishes need places of worship and/also places to meet and address the concerns of the present and the future, what are the most important 'next steps' for OLGC? Obviously we need a sanctuary for the highly valued celebration of the Eucharist and the sacramental life of the Church. We also need meeting space for encounter and working on the various ministries and projects that we have and which will also evolve over the next few years.

The average age of our parishioners, children included, is 44. The composition of those moving into the area is changing too. We have some areas dedicated to Senior living either by intention (e.g. the Cascades, Glenmore) or by majority choice (e.g. The Legends). Then again we have many communities of significantly mixed ages (e.g. Whisper Ridge, Sevilla, Murabella, Heritage Landing, King and the Bear, The Residences, Palencia, Saint Johns). There are also new areas being developed that are specifically targeting the interests of younger persons (e.g. Trailmark is an example of changing values) with hiking trails, etc.

These communities show us that our profile is not monolithic. Demographics, information on future population growth and trends in parishioner participation and financial support are among the many considerations that will help guide the architects and committee in identifying how to best meet the facility needs of the parish.

PROGRAMMING STUDY:

Currently, the Facility Planning Committee is preparing a programming study that is the first step in evaluating needs and determining estimates for space allocations to accommodate liturgical activities and the various parish ministries. Included in this will be present needs, and those needs highlighted by likely emerging trends. If we build for the future, only considering what we are used to in the present, we may make some very serious mistakes. As I mentioned above, the landscape of Church in America, including the Catholic Church, is changing dramatically. For the sake of the Church's mission, and also for prudent use of our resources, we must do our due diligence and decide well.

AN IMMEDIATE NEED:

Another more timely concern also adds complications to our task. Our current on-site well and septic systems will not accommodate future expansion. Also, the county requires that we connect to the new lines that have been installed on State Road 16 when we do future expansions OR if permitted repairs become needed on the present system.

In all likelihood, the new sewer connection will also require a special pumping system, referred to as a Lift Station, to facilitate the flow of material from our facilities out to the main line on State Road 16.

The design of new water and sewer systems, retention ponds, driveways and parking areas to meet the long term needs of the parish and to ensure that this work is done in an effective and cost efficient manner is a major part of the considerations and planning work of the committee.

This work, called 'horizontal development', mostly involves underground infrastructure or other items such as code-required parking. Informed estimates are minimally \$1 million for just that aspect of the work! This planning, including for connections to the public water and sewer systems, will likely become urgent in the near future.

SUMMARY:

In summary, developing specific plans for new facilities and how the renovations to existing facilities will best serve the parish, now and into the future, is an important endeavor. The planning committee is addressing all of the important issues and is committed to making the best use of our resources.

We ask for your considerations and prayers of support for the work of the committee. As the work of the committee progresses, be assured that we will be bringing status updates forward for public information and discussion.

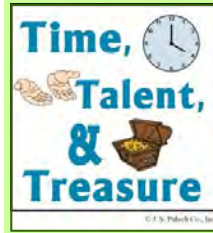

"Protecting God's Children" Requirement for Volunteers: All volunteers over the age of 18 working with minor children or vulnerable adults must be fingerprinted and background check through the Diocese (this is done on a national level and is to be renewed every 5 years). Please contact Parish Office for registration instructions. These volunteers must also attend a class called "Protecting God's Children" ("PGC"). Please provide a copy of your completed "PGC" certificate to our Parish Office. Classes can be found online at www.virtus.org. A diocesan volunteer application must be submitted to OLGC Parish Office. Please call the Parish Office if you have any questions. **No persons ministering with minor children or vulnerable adults may do so unless they have fully completed all requirements (Diocesan policy per Bishop Estévez).**

A Program for Troubled Marriages:

Retrouvaille 904-662-8604, www.retrouvaille.org

Marriage: To schedule a wedding, engaged couples must meet with their Pastor at least 8 months before their proposed wedding date. Preparation for the sacrament includes attending a diocesan program such as Engaged Encounter or Pre Cana, and completing the FOCCUS Inventory. All couples of child-bearing age also need to take a full Natural Family Planning course. Pre-registration for each of these programs is mandatory for all marriages within the Diocese of St Augustine.

Baptism: Preparation must be made in advance and Baptismal Class for the parents is required for those wishing to have their children baptized. **Class is First Saturday at 9 am, please contact Deacon Mark Sciullo: mvsциullo1981@gmail.com**

All Sponsors: Sponsors for all Sacraments must be **active** Catholics.
