OF THESE TRADITIONS ONE OF THE MOST SIGNIFICANT IS SURELY THE ONE YOU SEE BEFORE YOU TODAY. I DRAW YOUR ATTENTION TO THE DISPLAY YOU SEE BEFORE YOU [cover photo] OF A SOLDIER'S TOOLS.

THESE TOOLS WOULD NOT BE SEEN IN A CHURCH, OR A SYNAGOGUE OR EVEN THE SOLDIER'S FAVORITE CHAPEL. THIS IS A SCENE RESERVED FOR A FIELD OF BATTLE.

ON THE FIELD OF BATTLE WHEN THE SOUNDS HAVE FADED AND THE BATTLE IS DONE, BROTHER MUST TEND TO BROTHER, HONOR AND RESPECT THE ONE WHO HAS FOUGHT THE GOOD FIGHT.

THE SOLDIER'S TOOLS OF BATTLE ARE SIMPLE AND BASICALLY REMAIN UNCHANGED THROUGH THE YEARS. IT IS UNIQUE EVEN TO SOLDIERS THAT THE VERY TOOLS OF BATTLE WILL MARK THEIR FINAL RESTING PLACE.

BOOTS

RIFLE

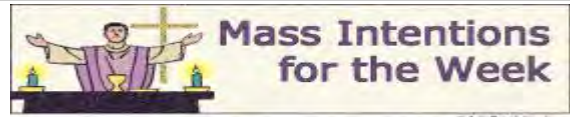
First Reading — There will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays (Malachi 3:19-20a).

"Feed My People" is a Thanksgiving Day Ministry sponsored by the Men's Club.

The focus is on low income, home bound senior citizens. Last year we served over 40 meals to 30+ families. Names are provided by Catholic Charities, the Council on Aging and the Sheriff's Office together with suggestions from the Parish.

Here's how it works: we provide a full Thanksgiving meal for each person (turkey and all the "fixins"). The Men's Club purchases, prepares and packages each meal. The meals are blessed at the 10:00 am Mass on Thanksgiving Day and, with the help of Map Quest, immediately delivered to each residence by volunteer parish families. That's it!!

Marriage: To schedule a wedding, engaged couples must meet with their Pastor at least 8 months before their proposed wedding date. Preparation for the sacrament includes attending a diocesan program such as Engaged Encounter or Pre Cana, and completing the FOCCUS Inventory. All couples of child-bearing age also need to take a full Natural Family Planning course. Pre-registration for each of these programs is mandatory for all marriages within the Diocese of St Augustine.
