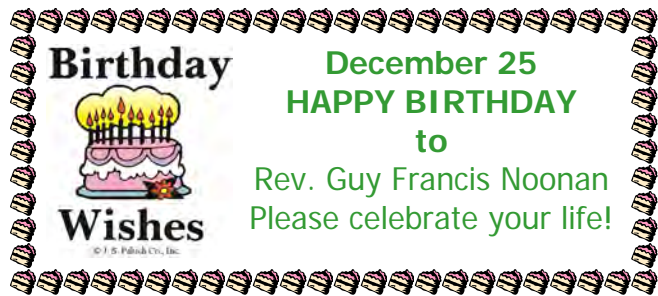

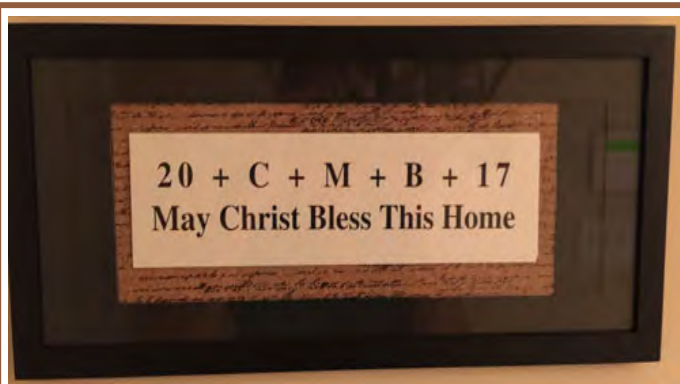


The regular meeting agenda will begin after our guests have finished.

This blessing form is to be distributed to all parishioners on December 18. Please consider framing this and placing over your main doorway.

On the feast of the Epiphany, which means "manifestation", it is traditional to ask God's blessing on our homes. The current year and the initials C, M, B are marked above the main doorway. There are 2 explanations for the 3 initials: Christus Mansionem Benedicat, which means, "May Christ bless this home." It is also the initials of the legendary names of the Magi (Casper, Melchior and Balthazar). While placing this blessing above the doorway of your home, say: "May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve Christ in everyone we meet. Amen."

Our parish will again celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany with an **International Food Tasting Event, a Festival of Nations**, after the



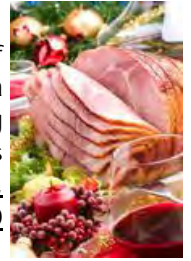

Dear Parishioners,

A good number of years ago I asked whether there might be interest in doing some social service ministry projects both within the parish area and also internationally, specifically in **Haiti**. There were a number of parishioners interested in one or the other of these regards.

Unfortunately the 'great' recession entered in around the same time and so many people and programs and projects have taken years to recover. Here at OLGc we are no different -- we lost 100 households or 20% of our parish at the time. It has taken us until now to recover from that.

In the interest of re-opening these areas of possibility we have scheduled an evening session of information regarding one well-established Haitian project entitled the "**Community Coalition for Haiti**".

Invited to this session as our presenters will be Doctor Wayne Reichman, vascular surgeon, and his wife Vickie. Both Wayne and Vickie are deeply involved in this Haitian project. They now divide their residence between here (Palencia) and Baltimore, Maryland.

YEAR END CHARITABLE DONATIONS:
Are you at least 70.5 years old?

- Pay no later than December 31, 2016.
- Total charitable distributions from your IRA may not exceed \$100,000 per year; other than this limit, distributions may be in any amount.
- Distributions must be made directly from the IRA custodian to qualified non-profit.
- Distributions must be outright charitable gifts (vs. contributions to funding annuities and other planned giving arrangements, which do not qualify).

The envelope is labeled "Mass Intentions". Please complete all requested information and note the instructions on the form. Suggested offering (Mass Stipend) is \$10.00, **make check payable to Rev. Guy Francis Noonan.**

"Protecting God's Children" Requirement for Volunteers: All volunteers over the age of 18 working with minor children or vulnerable adults must be fingerprinted and background check through the Diocese (this is done on a national level and is to be renewed every 5 years). Please contact Parish Office for registration instructions. These volunteers must also attend a class called "Protecting God's Children" ("PGC"). Please provide a copy of your completed "PGC" certificate to our Parish Office. Classes can be found online at www.virtus.org. A diocesan volunteer application must be submitted to OLGC Parish Office. Please call the Parish Office if you have any questions. **No persons ministering with minor children or vulnerable adults may do so unless they have fully completed all requirements (Diocesan policy per Bishop Estévez).**

A Program for Troubled Marriages:

Retrouvaille 904-662-8604, www.retrouvaille.org

Marriage: To schedule a wedding, engaged couples must meet with their Pastor at least 8 months before their proposed wedding date. Preparation for the sacrament includes attending a diocesan program such as Engaged Encounter or Pre Cana, and completing the FOCCUS Inventory. All couples of child-bearing age also need to take a full Natural Family Planning course. Pre-registration for each of these programs is mandatory for all marriages within the Diocese of St Augustine.

Baptism: Preparation must be made in advance and Baptismal Class for the parents is required for those wishing to have their children baptized. **Class is First Saturday at 9 am, please contact Deacon Mark Sciullo: mvsциullo1981@gmail.com**

All Sponsors: Sponsors for all Sacraments must be **active** Catholics. Anyone asking to receive a document from the parish to be a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation in another parish must be an **active** Catholic at OLGC. This implies regular Mass attendance and participation in the support of the community.

Sacramental Preparation for First Holy Eucharist/Reconciliation & Confirmation is a two-year program. Contact Donald Pepino 904-824-8688 or e-mail: olgc.don@gmail.com for further information.
