

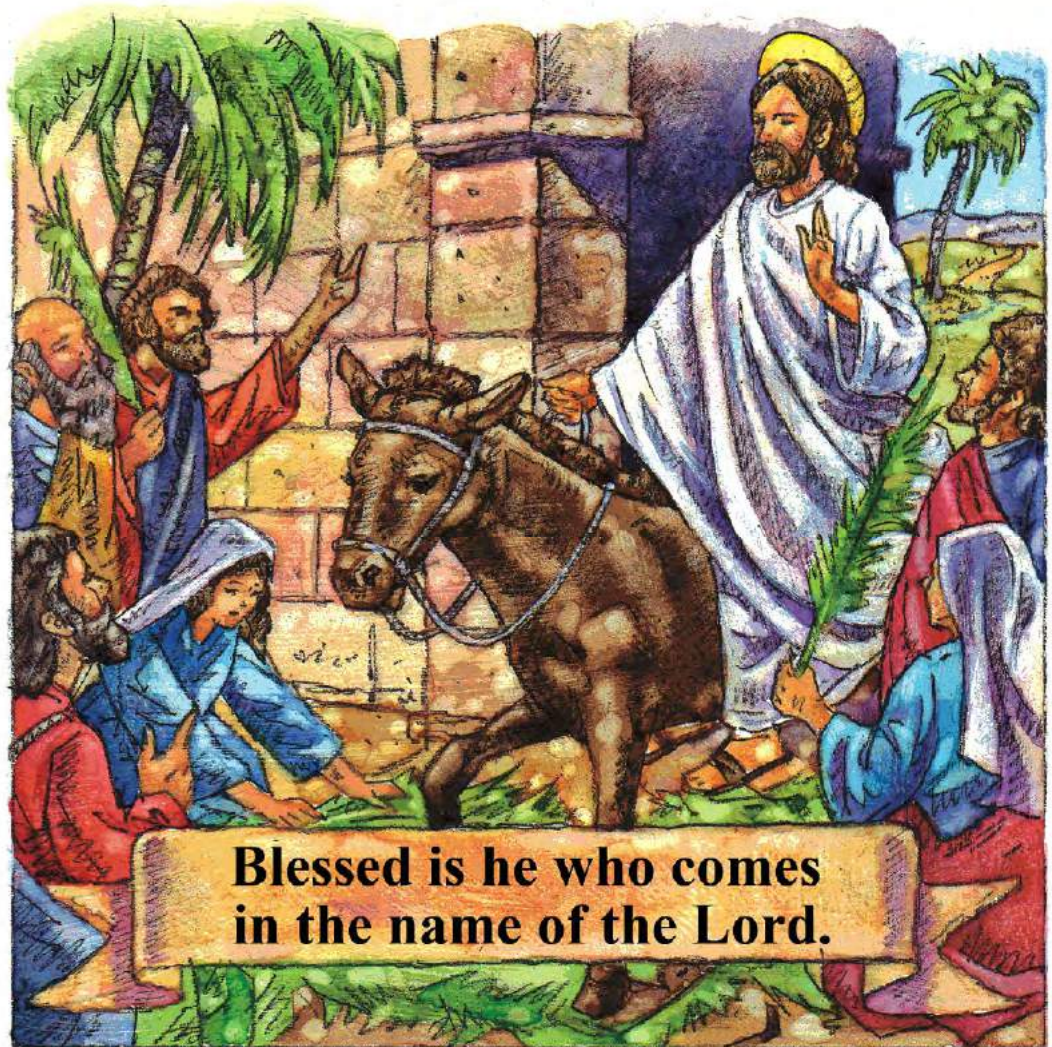

Divine Mercy Sunday - April 23, 2017

"Our mission on Earth is to share God's mercy with others." While He is always so generously pouring out His love and mercy on us - every single day - there is at least one day in particular when He does so in an extraordinary way: Divine Mercy Sunday. Divine Mercy Sunday is April 23 and now is a great time to prepare to receive its extraordinary graces. Regarding this grace-filled day, Jesus says to St. Faustina in her diary:

"On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My Mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment" (Diary, 669).

This is great news! Jesus is saying that if we go to confession (preferably during the week before Divine Mercy Sunday), are in a state of grace, and receive Holy Communion on Divine Mercy Sunday (April 23) with the desire to receive the graces of His promise, then we shall receive them. (Fr. Joseph, MIC)

The tri-fold flyer will help you to prepare to receive God's Mercy. **The Divine Mercy Novena** begins on **Good Friday, April 14, and ends Saturday, April 22.** You can say the Novena at any time of day in your own home, but preferably at 3 PM as this is the Hour of Great Mercy.

May you have a blessed Holy Week, and Easter, and a grace-filled Divine Mercy Sunday!

You are reminded of the Church's laws for **fast and abstinence during Lent.**



Good Friday is a day of **fasting**. Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are permitted one full meal and two lesser meals per day (which together should not equal one full meal), with no eating between meals.

All Fridays of Lent are days of **abstinence**. Catholics who are 14 years or older should abstain from meat entirely. Soups and gravies made from meat are permitted.
