Dear Parishioners,

A number of years ago, just before the most recent recession, I had asked whether any parishioners might be interested in 'mission' work within and outside the United States. At that time there were varied persons who inquired of one or the other. This is the Catholic Church at its best, local and universal.



The recession put a halt to those considerations!

That said, I am please to inform you that interest has returned, most immediately with research into cooperation with an organization in Haiti. A committee of parishioners has been studying this for about a year now, and we have decided to partner with the **"Community Coalition for Haiti" (CCH)** because they have a solid infrastructure already well established on the Island.

As an organization, CCH has three foci: medical, communal development (such as wells, school buildings, etc) and education (elementary, religious education, etc). There are persons in our parish who have interest in serving and assisting in all those areas. We are also hoping to develop the capacity for some of our High School youth to participate too.

Enclosed in the bulletin this week is a tri-fold flyer that we developed. It explains the basic sense of the Haiti Project that we have in mind. Also enclosed is a one page sheet which details suggested ways to support this mission, including 'alternate gifts' for birthdays and anniversaries, etc. This will also be available to our guests at the *Fall Festiv'All* and as part of our Advent *Giving Tree*.

You will be hearing more of this as time goes on. My hope is that this will be a great moment of mission both for our parish and our partners to be in Haiti itself.

DAMAGE TO OLGC CHURCH PROPERTY DURING HURRICANE IRMA:

We sustained about \$15,000 worth of damage during Hurricane Irma, and have been in the process of making repairs. Included in the damage were things like: awning at office entry (blew off and bounced over the roof to the other side near Cuccina); sign by the cross garden; sofit damage to Mary's Garden; roofing damage to main building; felled tree and new carbon-fiber parking lot pole and lamp; a few varied other things.

Most of the damage should be repaired in the next few weeks. We are blessed a thousand times compared to others.

DIRECT AID TO PUERTO RICO:

Some of our OLGC parishioners have immediate relatives living in Puerto Rico. You can send supplies in general, or you can send to particular persons (we have a number of parishioners with immediate family on the island).

Helpful supplies would include: dry pasta, rice, dry beans, Britta water filters, batteries (sizes AA, C, D.), canned meat and tuna, peanut butter, jelly, water purification pills (available through camping/hunting stores?), Chex Mix, peanuts, dried fruit, soap for personal and laundry use, etc. FLASH LIGHTS that are solar or crank powered. Small transistor radios with proper battery size. **NO CLOTHING.**

You can send packages for particular persons or in general in two (2) ways:

- 1.) Directly to Puerto Rico with the following address: Box 1126 industrial Luchetti, Bayamon, PR 00960
- 2.) You can also send packages to Daytona Beach: to **Braddock Metallurgical, 400 Fentress Boulevard, Daytona Beach, FL 32114, Attention: Jeff Young.**

In this instance, Braddock will ship by crate periodically over the next few weeks.

If the package is for the population in general, that is all you need to do.

However, if the packages are for particular persons, you must communicate with your intended recipient in Puerto Rico and tell them to contact one of the following two people in Puerto Rico so that your intended recipient in Puerto Rico can then go to the depot in Bayamon, Puerto Rico to acquire their package(s): Box 1126 industrial Luchetti, Bayamon, PR 00960.

MAJOR CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING

The Church in the Modern World (Gaudium et Spes):

The Second Vatican Council (attended by bishops from all corners of the world) focuses on responding to “the joys and the hopes, the grief and the anguish of the people of our time,” especially the poor (no. 1). The Council develops a theological basis for the **Church’s engagement in the world**, noting how the Church must interpret the signs of the times, both positive (growing wealth, unity, and communication) and negative (hunger and disease, war, the **wealth gap**, divisions based on nation, class, and race, etc.) in light of the Gospel. The Council emphasizes the Church’s concern for human dignity, the solidarity of the human community, the important role of human work and activity in the world, and the **engagement of the Church in society and the world**. The second part focuses on marriage and family, **cultural diversity**, social and economic life, political life, **peace and war**, international cooperation, and the need for **integral human development**, which is person-centered and includes spiritual development.

Mass Intentions: If you would like to have a Mass said for a special intention, please pick up the "Mass Intention Request Form" (printed on purple paper) found in the Church Entrance Area in the wooden wall display and drop it into the collection basket or mail it to the Parish Office. The envelope is labeled "Mass Intentions". Please complete all requested information and note the instructions on the form. Suggested offering (Mass Stipend) is \$10.00, **make check payable to Rev. Guy Francis Noonan.**

Requirement for Volunteers "Protecting God's Children": All volunteers over the age of 18 working with minor children or vulnerable adults must be fingerprinted and background check through the Diocese (this is done on a national level and is to be renewed every 5 years). Please contact Parish Office for registration instructions. These volunteers must also attend a class called "Protecting God's Children" ("PGC"). Please provide a copy of your completed "PGC" certificate to our Parish Office. Classes can be found online at www.virtus.org. A diocesan volunteer application must be submitted to OLG Parish Office. Please call the Parish Office if you have any questions. **No persons ministering with minor children or vulnerable adults may do so unless they have fully completed all requirements (Diocesan policy per Bishop Estévez).**

Baptism: Preparation must be made in advance and Baptismal Class for the parents is required for those wishing to have their children baptized. **Class is First Saturday at 9 am, please contact Deacon Mark Sciuillo: mvsciuillo1981@gmail.com**

All Sponsors: Sponsors for all Sacraments must be **active** Catholics. Anyone asking to receive a document from the parish to be a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation in another parish must be an **active** Catholic at OLG. This implies regular Mass attendance and participation in the support of the community.

Sacramental Preparation for First Holy Eucharist/Reconciliation & Confirmation is a two-year program. Contact Donald Pepino 904-824-8688 or e-mail: olgc.don@gmail.com for further information.
