Dear Parishioners,

Please find enclosed the annual operating report for the past fiscal year (July 1, 2016-June 30, 2017). These figures reflect a number of things regarding our parish life:

Approximately 48-50% of parishioners contribute to the financial support of the Parish. Their generosity speaks for itself in so many ways. And indeed, for so many, generosity is not simply reflected in financial affairs, but also many give in countless other ways wherein the varied ministries of the parish continue to grow and flourish. These are ministries of outreach beyond the parish members, and also in-reach within the parish itself. In many ways, they represent the ongoing development of a solid foundation for reaching out toward future growth.

As part of re-tooling our in-reach, we have further developed our K-8 Religious Education program to include the families in 7 sessions with their children. We are also blessed that this year's 8th grade students seem to be morphing well into our High School Youth Group. As part of our outreach we are not only focused on varied social ministries but also on more concrete communication to those who are new to their area.

Clearly our area is developing quickly, this after many spurts and stops along the past 9 years, many housing developments are popping North, South, East and West of us. This presages many more and younger families. One concrete sign of this growth is that in addition to three existing public grade schools, a fourth has been added on South Pacetti Road between Publix and the Old Church (now housing our Boutique).

All this growth surely challenges us to address increasing evangelization and mission needs. Space will be one of those factors. (Did you know that our building is used approximately 1,800 times per year, not counting Masses?)

A committee has been looking at what next steps might be reasonable for adding facilities to our rather attractive campus. A committee is addressing this and we hope within a few months to be able to begin sharing our findings and getting feedback from the parish at large through a designed feasibility study and town meetings.

One very fortuitous development is that the Diocese has assumed all our land debt in swap for approximately 6 acres adjacent to the cemetery on its Eastern boundary. We owed the Diocese about \$2 million in land debt, accruing from 1998 and forward. With that debt now off our books, we can move forward in a focused manner toward addressing our increasingly pressing development needs.

Be assured that this will be a communal process, seeking to engage those who are engaged with us.



In closing, I thank all parishioners who share so willingly and effectively their time, treasure and talent, and I invite all who benefit from our facilities to do the same.

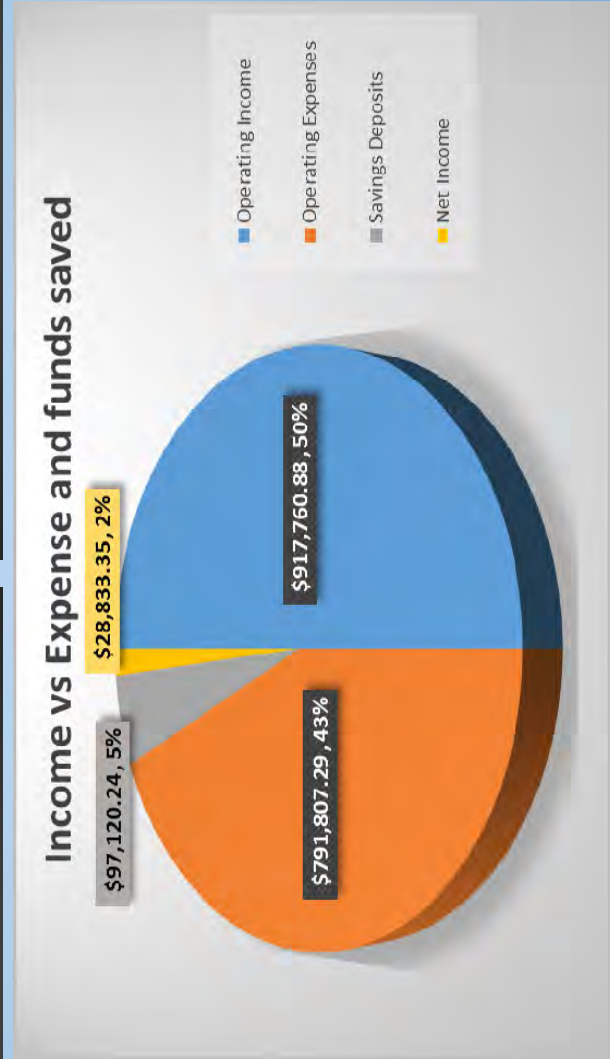
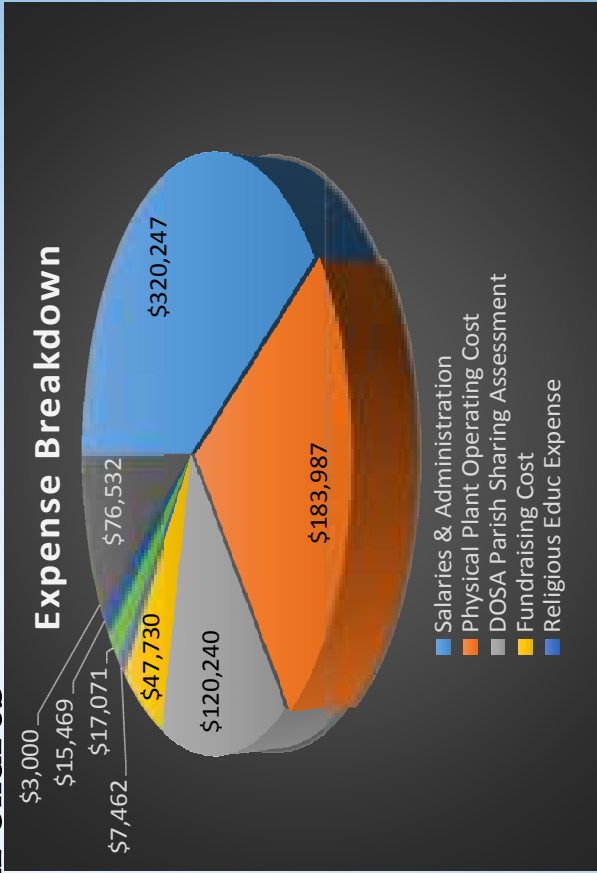
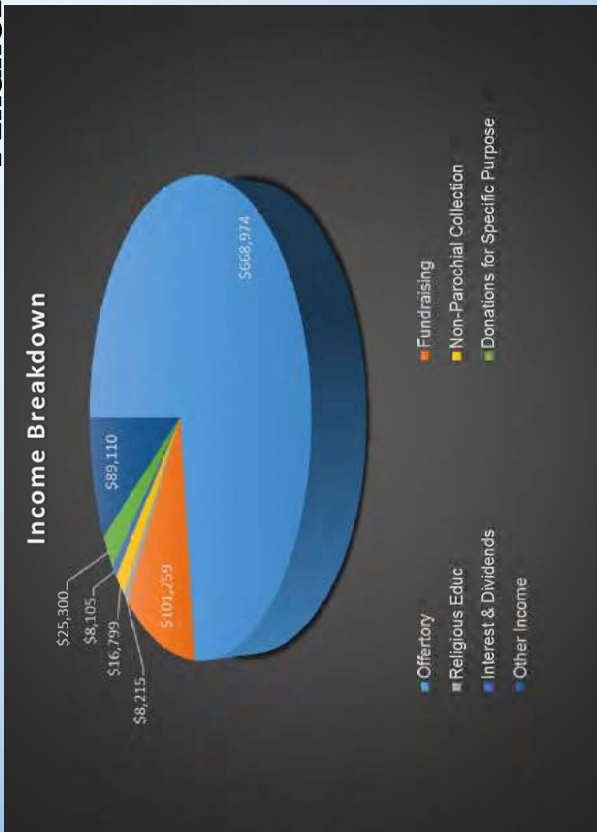

Additional Information

1. As stated last year, our plant and equipment are aging. This continues to be an issue going forward, so the need to have monies available for timely repair and replacement continues to be a vital part of our stewardship responsibilities. As shown above monies continue to be put into a reserve account to help meet these needs.
2. The parish has also set aside monies for Catastrophic Reserves. The monies are in savings account at the Diocese. In order to be exempt from Diocesan taxes, these saved monies are not to exceed \$25,000 per year.
3. As of June 30, 2017 the Parish had a land debt obligation to the Diocese of approximately \$2,000,000. On August 15, 2017 the Diocese agreed to forgive the entire debt in exchange for the parish owned corner property located at SR 16 & World Golf Village

DIRECT AID TO PUERTO RICO:

Some of our OLGC parishioners have immediate relatives living in Puerto Rico. You can send supplies in general, or you can send to particular persons (we have a number of parishioners with immediate family on the island).

Helpful supplies would include: dry pasta, rice, dry beans, Britta water filters, batteries (sizes AA, C, D.), canned meat and tuna, peanut butter, jelly. water purification pills (available through camping/hunting stores?), Chex Mix, peanuts, dried fruit, soap for personal and laundry use, etc. FLASH LIGHTS that are solar or crank powered. Small transistor radios with proper battery size. **NO CLOTHING.**

You can send packages for particular persons or in general in two (2) ways:

- 1.) Directly to Puerto Rico with the following address: Box 1126 industrial Luchetti, Bayamon, PR 00960
- 2.) You can also send packages to Daytona Beach: to **Braddock Metallurgical, 400 Fentress Boulevard, Daytona Beach, FL 32114, Attention: Jeff Young.**

In this instance, Braddock will ship by crate periodically over the next few weeks.

If the package is for the population in general, that is all you need to do.

However, if the packages are for particular persons, you must communicate with your intended recipient in Puerto Rico and tell them to contact one of the following two people in Puerto Rico so that your intended recipient in Puerto Rico can then go to the depot in Bayamon, Puerto Rico to acquire their package(s): Box 1126 industrial Luchetti, Bayamon, PR 00960.
