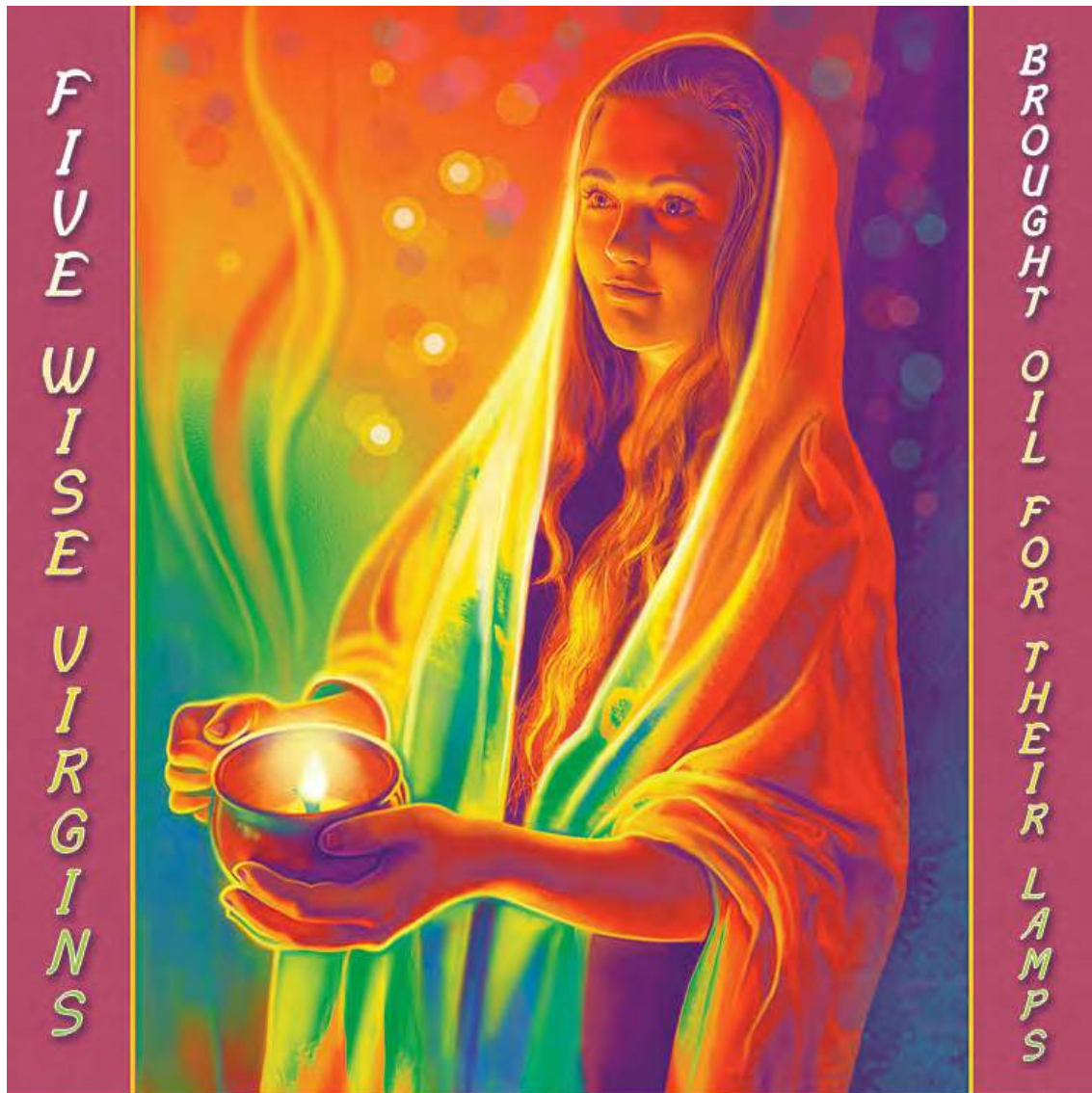

ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT of OPERATIONS:

A few persons were at a social and asked me about what is under the category of “miscellaneous”/“other operating expenditures” in the Annual Financial Report that we put in the Bulletin the week of October 29th. The figure was about \$72,000+. This category ‘catches’ a wide variety of items. For example, a topographical survey for future construction; that cost about \$20,000. It also covers expenses of varied ministries; that figure is about \$25,000. Those 2 figures represent over 60%. We will clarify in a future Bulletin the numbers in that category.

BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE:

Based on the recent and planned household construction in the World Golf Village area, our parish worship and meeting space is becoming increasingly strained. Currently, the church/hall is used over 1,800 times a year, excluding weekend Masses and the section where the Parish Offices are located.

We need to plan for future needs and consider the best use of our available resources.

In order to address this, the parish Facility Committee has been working to update the master plan for the development of future facility needs. The committee, following diocesan building guidelines and with the assistance of Kasper Architects and a local engineering firm, is developing a conceptual plan that considers the next steps for parish facilities and how the overall parish property would be developed into the future.

When the committee and the architect complete their work in a form that it is ready for presentation to the parish community, the proposed plans for parish facilities will be available for review and discussion in a variety of settings.

“TAKE AND READ” — Parish **“Free Book Lending Library”**: The quote comes from the writings of St. Augustine: statesman, orator, scholar, bishop and saint. How often Catholics do exactly the opposite — they’ll take and read anything (Wall Street Journal, New York Times, Economist, novels, newspapers, sports, stock indexes, cook books, nutrition labels, diet books, men’s and women’s magazines) — anything BUT something pertaining to faith and spiritual development.

If you’d like to distinguish yourself by becoming part of an incredibly small and select group, **TAKE AND READ** about spirit and growth. Develop the habit of doing this regularly, along with all the other lovely things that catch our attention. It’s really amazing that so often Catholics of all ages say things like ‘I finished my religious education when I received the Sacrament of Confirmation’. Really...?

Also a comment about the Sunday scriptures: We’re for the most part adults, and many with children. The idea that a priest or deacon should be expected to keep my interest for ten or fifteen+ minutes (how dare he) when I do nothing to prepare for the topic — like reading the scriptures beforehand during the week and mulling over them alone or with others to prep myself — suggests being very passive to the Eucharist. Kind of like a consumer going to a restaurant and ordering a really lovely meal with a delicate wine and then saying to the waiter ‘Now you feed me’. Kind of nuts, no! Especially weird when we stop and think that often enough people will go on line to check out a menu before they go to the feast. Same thing with holiday buffets — people study what’s on the menu.

By the way, the homily is meant to break open one or more areas of the readings or prayers for our further reflection. Two surveys have been done in the parish and both showed the same general results: a clear majority of about 87% find the homilies helpful to very helpful. Then again, about 12% find them unhelpful or boring. I wonder if the results would be different if we each had more skin in the game before we heard the readings.

DIRECT AID TO PUERTO RICO:

Some of our OLGC parishioners have immediate relatives living in Puerto Rico. You can send supplies in general, or you can send to particular persons (we have a number of parishioners with immediate family on the island).

Helpful supplies would include: dry pasta, rice, dry beans, Britta water filters, batteries (sizes AA, C, D.), canned meat and tuna, peanut butter, jelly, water purification pills (available through camping/hunting stores?), Chex Mix, peanuts, dried fruit, soap for personal and laundry use, etc. FLASH LIGHTS that are solar or crank powered. Small transistor radios with proper battery size. **NO CLOTHING.**

You can send packages for particular persons or in general in two (2) ways:

- 1.) Directly to Puerto Rico with the following address: Box 1126 industrial Luchetti, Bayamon, PR 00960
- 2.) You can also send packages to Daytona Beach: to **Braddock Metallurgical, 400 Fentress Boulevard, Daytona Beach, FL 32114, Attention: Jeff Young.**

In this instance, Braddock will ship by crate periodically over the next few weeks.

If the package is for the population in general, that is all you need to do.

However, if the packages are for particular persons, you must communicate with your intended recipient in Puerto Rico and tell them to contact one of the following two people in Puerto Rico so that your intended recipient in Puerto Rico can then go to the depot in Bayamon, Puerto Rico to acquire their package(s): Box 1126 industrial Luchetti, Bayamon, PR 00960.
