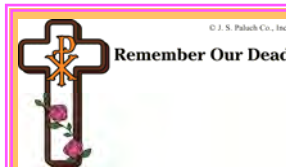

Dear Parishioners:

Over the past year and one half we have been looking at varied areas of parish life and ministry that were focused upon during the development of a five-year plan. Within that context we started a Welcome New Members Committee, have started a revamp of K-8 Religious Education, and are looking at varied aspects of the Liturgy. (A survey will be coming out regarding the same). We are also considering 'down the road' a bit further, varied topics that might be considered for Adult Religious Formation, and some other initiatives.

Part of the Catholic Faith, indeed a **core** aspect of the faith (PP. Paul VI), is the body of Church teachings regarding social issues and justice. In fact, a considerable corpus of works has developed over the past years, at least from PP Leo XIII (d. July 20, 1903) all the way through to the present Pope and Bishop of Rome, Francis.

Although these are core considerations ranging on a wide spectrum of topics addressed and evolving over the years, the majority of Catholics are unfamiliar with these teachings. In order to begin familiarizing us as a community to these concerns we are starting a weekly "Catholic Social Teaching" corner in the bulletin. Perhaps this will foster some interesting discussions among us as we consider the implications of our baptismal witness in our homes, church and also society.

"Protecting God's Children" Requirement for Volunteers: All volunteers over the age of 18 working with minor children or vulnerable adults must be fingerprinted and background check through the Diocese (this is done on a national level and is to be renewed every 5 years). Please contact Parish Office for registration instructions. These volunteers must also attend a class called "Protecting God's Children" ("PGC"). Please provide a copy of your completed "PGC" certificate to our Parish Office. Classes can be found online at www.virtus.org. A diocesan volunteer application must be submitted to OLGC Parish Office. Please call the Parish Office if you have any questions. **No persons ministering with minor children or vulnerable adults may do so unless they have fully completed all requirements (Diocesan policy per Bishop Estévez).**

Marriage: To schedule a wedding, engaged couples must meet with their Pastor at least 8 months before their proposed wedding date. Preparation for the sacrament includes attending a diocesan program such as Engaged Encounter or Pre Cana, and completing the FOCCUS Inventory. All couples of child-bearing age also need to take a full Natural Family Planning course. Pre-registration for each of these programs is mandatory for all marriages within the Diocese of St Augustine.
