MAJOR CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING



On Christianity and Social Progress (Mater et Magistra) Pope John XXIII comments on changes in recent decades such as communication advances, increases in workers' rights and social programs, and the **decline of colonialism**, or the political or economic control by stronger countries of weaker ones. He notes the world's global interdependence and expresses profound concern about the arms race and the growing inequalities between rich and poor nations, noting that gains in science and technology should not lead to economic disparity but should instead benefit the common good. John XXIII also expresses concern about the **plight of small farmers and rural areas**, calls for greater participation of workers in industry and new forms of agricultural support, and notes that **respect for culture** must be emphasized in the Church's missionary activities.

Intervention by governments is needed to address global problems, he says, but should also respect the principle of subsidiarity (allowing the people closest to a problem to help resolve it with social support as needed). Finally, he proposes that Christians should engage in a process of observing, judging, and acting to put the Church's social doctrine into practice.

DIRECT AID TO PUERTO RICO:

Some of our OLGC parishioners have immediate relatives living in Puerto Rico. You can send supplies in general, or you can send to particular persons (we have a number of parishioners with immediate family on the island).

Helpful supplies would include: dry pasta, rice, dry beans, Britta water filters, batteries (sizes AA, C, D.), canned meat and tuna, peanut butter, jelly, water purification pills (available through camping/hunting stores?), Chex Mix, peanuts, dried fruit, soap for personal and laundry use, etc. **FLASH LIGHTS** that are solar or crank powered. Small transistor radios with proper battery size. **NO CLOTHING**.

You can send packages for particular persons or in general in two (2) ways:

- 1.) Directly to Puerto Rico with the following address: Box 1126 industrial Luchetti, Bayamon, PR 00960
- 2.) You can also send packages to Daytona Beach: to **Braddock Metallurgical, 400 Fentress Boulevard, Daytona Beach, FL 32114, Attention: Jeff Young.**

In this instance, Braddock will ship by crate periodically over the next few weeks.

If the package is for the population in general, that is all you need to do.

However, if the packages are for particular persons, you must communicate with your intended recipient in Puerto Rico and tell them to contact one of the following two people in Puerto Rico so that your intended recipient in Puerto Rico can then go to the depot in Bayamon, Puerto Rico to acquire their package(s): Box 1126 industrial Luchetti, Bayamon, PR 00960.

You should also put this contact information inside the package and make sure your recipient's name, address and phone number in Puerto Rico are on the box.

The after-Mass, Pod 1, hospitality area needs to also be policed. As you leave, crumbs and other items left behind on the table or floor leads to bugs and varmints which no one wants.
